

How Can I Become A Christian?

1. Admit that God is not first in your life and ask Him to forgive your sins. (*1 John 1:9*)
2. Believe that Jesus died to pay for your sins and that He rose again on Easter and is alive today. (*Romans 10:9*)
3. Accept God's free gift of salvation. Don't try to earn it. (*Ephesians 2:8,9*)
4. Through prayer, invite Jesus Christ to come into your life and be the director (Lord) of your life. (*John 1:12-13*)

What to pray:

Dear Lord Jesus,
I know that I am a sinner and need Your forgiveness. I believe that You died for my sins. Please come into my life and make me a new person. From now on I want You to be the director of my life. Amen.

3. Immutability is the theological term that describes God's unchanging nature. Read the following verses and then answer the questions.

Exodus 3:11-15
1 Samuel 15:29
Malachi 3:6
Numbers 23:19
Psalm 102:25-27
Hebrews 13:8
James 1:17

What does God's name reveal about Him in Exodus 3:11-15?

In light of these verses, do you think any aspects of God ever change? Can His emotions change? Does He ever have mood swings? Can He grow and change over time like we do? Can He ever "have a bad day"?

Do you think circumstances or events can change the way God relates to us?

5. Now read Psalm 18:30; Isaiah 40:6-8; and 46:10. What do these passages tell us about God's Word and His promises?

What do they reveal about God's purposes and plans?

6. Read Ephesians 1:14 and Hebrews 6:17-18. What hope do these unchanging truths about God give you in your daily life?
